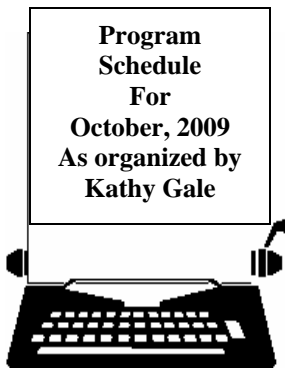

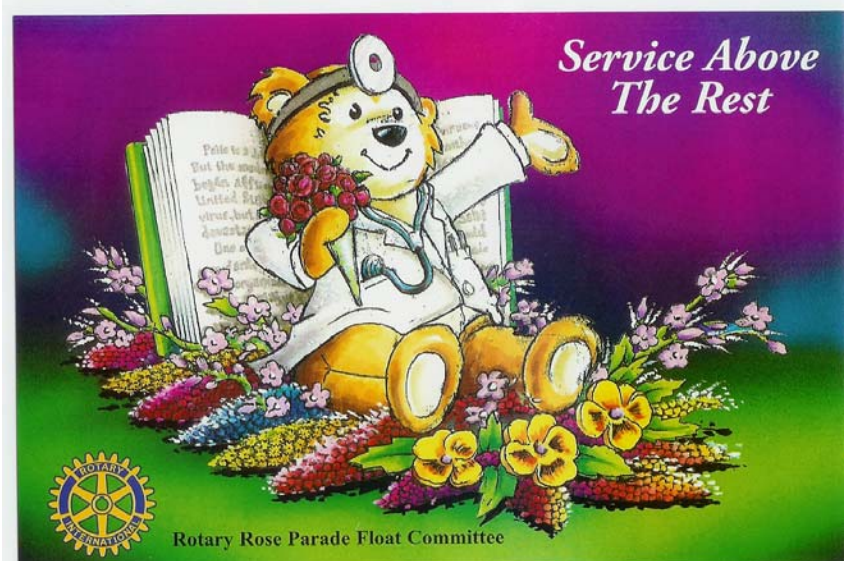

2010 Rotary Rose Parade Float: Rotary's entry in the 2010 parade will be the 31st consecutive entry on behalf of Rotary and celebrates the work of Rotarians worldwide. The theme of the 121st parade is "A Cut Above the Rest." The theme of Rotary's float this year is "Service Above the Rest." The float is not a project of Rotary International and no RI funds are used in its construction. The ability to enter a float is dependent solely on the generosity of Rotarians. Each year hundreds of volunteers donate more than 6500 hours in preparing the decorations and applying them to the float. Many Rotarians work on the float, but most of the work is done by Rotaract and Interact members. We will once again be "passing the hat" for your donations. Whatever we collect is what we will send.

World Community Service Grant Applications

You may or may not be aware as a result of the poor economy and a reduced budget, Rotary International has already committed all the funds they allocated for Matching Grants in 2009-2010. This is about as was expected. Several grant applications from our district have been approved and will be funded. However, there are a number of applications that have received a letter from RI telling them that they have three choices, one find funding elsewhere, two using District Designated Funds to complete the project, or three reapplying next July. There may even be grant applications that clubs plan to submit later this year but are unaware of the funding situations. The World Community Service Grant committee had already considered this as a possible outcome and will be meeting on October 14th to discuss how we will deal with the Grant applications from District 6270 that will not receive matching support from RI this year.
