WAUKESHA TOASTMASTERS CLUB INVITES ROTARY STUDENT SPEAKERS TO PRESENT

On February 11, 2010, our Rotary Student Speakers were invited to present their speeches at the Waukesha Toastmasters Club. The Rotary Student Speakers program started in 1997 at White Rock School with three 4th graders, none of whom continued into the 5th grade. Every year since then, the principal and staff of White Rock have selected two students from 4th grade for the program. Students are also selected to start from other grades as students drop out. Presently, there are 15 students in the program with 9 Rotary coaches. Each Rotarian coaches one or two students. Students continue in the program through middle school and high school, through 12th grade, usually Central Middle School and South High School. If students change schools while in the program, they are followed to other schools. The Waukesha School District and all schools participating strongly back the program. The high school students, 9th through 12th grades, receive ½ credit as a community service project for their participation in the program. High School students are also challenged to present a speech annually to the public speaking group, Toastmasters.
